Useful Information

The Venue: The forthcoming Conference is again to be held on the campus of the University of Kent. The modern and comfortable buildings are situated on a wooded hill overlooking the historic city of Canterbury. The location is particularly convenient for those coming from the continent or London by train or car. Visit the website: www.biblecentre.org for more information about the conference and ways to get there.

Travel Directions: The Campus is conveniently reached by M2/A2 motorway from either London City & Gatwick Airports, Ashford International Rail Station, Dover or Folkestone Ports.

Arrival and Registration: The University of Kent will not accommodate early arrivals. Please do not arrive before 3.00 pm on Tuesday 14 April '09. On arrival collect your room key, and name badge from the Office and our Registration Desk.

Parking: Ample parking is available, but you will need to collect a permit from our registration desk for display on the inside of your car windscreen. Drive and park only where authorised.

Transport help: If you can offer a spare seat to and/or from the Conference, let us know in good time what you can do to help. There are usually a number of guests in need of a lift. Offers of 'taxi' service with your car can be a real help. Please let us know at our contact address: 'Conference 2009', etc.

On Campus: transport can be arranged, if needed, for elderly, infirm, disabled, etc. PLEASE ASK FOR THIS SERVICE when returning the registration form.

Accommodation: If you would like to take advantage of the accommodation at the Campus you should register as soon as possible. Almost all the rooms are single rooms – i.e. for one person. No specific 'family rooms' are available, a young child may be accommodated in their parents' twin room – if they have a travel cot. A very few rooms offer twin beds. **It is essential that you occupy the room allocated to you and that you do not sleep elsewhere on the campus.** Rooms must be vacated by 9.00am on day of departure, including the final morning (Sat.) and the key handed in to the Office. The provision of rooms in the University includes bed and breakfast. Tea/coffee making facilities are in every room. Bed-linen & towels are provided. Please make sure that your booking for accommodation and/or meals is firm. Early departures and late cancellations or changes to arrangements will cost us non-refundable deposits and fees. Please ensure, as far as you are able, that you keep your booking. If you must cancel – please DO NOT leave or stay away without the courtesy of letting us know in good time. We suggest you make a copy of your booking form to help you remember what you committed yourself to!

Children are welcome but **must** be under control at all times: especially near the University offices and in the shared dining areas. **Under 18's** must be accompanied by a known, responsible adult, who will monitor the minor during the course of the conference. A crèche for under-11s is planned. Mothers are asked to take turns in the care of their children.

Teens are being considered with an interesting additional programme for some of the time. Details to be arranged.

Security: Be vigilant, watch out for thieves! Leave nothing of value unattended. When on Campus please wear your conference identity name badge! The badge is also your meal ticket. No badge - No food.

Costs: No charge is made, but the cost of the Conference is about £160.00 (€200) (US\$275) (as at time of printing (Oct. '08)) per head – this includes accommodation, meals, translation equipment, overhead costs, etc. Lack of funds should not prevent attendance by any sincerely exercised to come. We trust the Lord will supply resources to help those who cannot afford to come and to meet all the expenses. Gifts may be made by cheque or credit card to Chapter Two. There is space on the registration form: UK taxpayers may do so under the Gift Aid Scheme, please tick the box if so.

Hymn singing: The music/words edition of the *Spiritual Songs* (1978) hymnbook will be used. You may buy your own from the bookstall but do write your name in it! Musical instruments (*bring them along if you can play!*) may be used after the meetings in the evening communal hymn-singing.

Testimony: Smoking and the consumption of alcohol on or near the Campus by Conference attendees is unacceptable and will harm our Christian testimony. Please bear in mind that your conduct will reflect on the opinion of the world has of Christians.
